This will be a shortened program, so we can have lunch and start the auction (see article below) by noon.



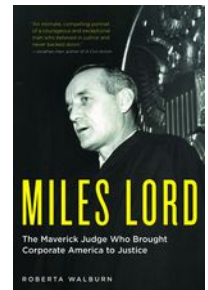
PROJECTZAWADI

March 18 – Miles Lord

Roberta Walburn is an attorney and author of the new book *Miles Lord: The Maverick Judge Who Brought Corporate America to Justice*. This is the story of Miles Lord (1919–2016) who rose from humble beginnings on Minnesota's Iron Range to become one of the most colorful and powerful judges in the country, described as "an unabashed Prairie populist" and "a live-wire slayer of corporate behemoths, he came of age alongside a cadre of young Midwestern social-gospel progressives, including Hubert H. Humphrey, Eugene McCarthy, and Walter Mondale.



March 25 – America and the World after Trump

Tom Hanson is former Foreign Service Officer who has spoken at Pilgrim House several times, both as part of the Great Decisions programs as well as on Sunday mornings. Tom is one of the most sought-after commentators on Foreign Policy in the Twin Cities.

He will discuss his view of the dramatic changes made by the Trump administration to our international alliances, trade agreements, and moral leadership around the world.

GREAT DECISIONS AT PILGRIM HOUSE

March 1 – China's Geopolitics

In the last 15 years, China has implemented a wide-ranging strategy of economic outreach and expansion of all its national capacities, including military and diplomatic capacities. Where the United States has taken a step back from multilateral trade agreements and discarded the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), China has made inroads through efforts like the Belt and Road Initiative and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). What are Beijing's geopolitical objectives? What leadership and political conditions in each society underlie growing Sino-American tensions? What policies might Washington adopt to address this circumstance?

Our speaker will be Rob Scarlett, President of Medical Equipment Exports, Inc.; Senior Adviser to Clearwater Layline, LLC; Senior Associate at Grupo Avance, LLC; and former President of Smart Screen Systems, Inc. Since 1999, he has led Hunter Scarlett Consulting, serving as a director or officer for start-ups in the US, Europe, and Latin America. A senior manager with experience in global market development and international marketing, Rob is fluent in English, German, Spanish, and Portuguese. He graduated from Carleton College. He has spent much of the past 50 years working in Latin America and visited Cuba in 1997 at the invitation of the Cuban Mining Ministry.
