Professor Dennis Jones is a band member of Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation. He taught the Ojibwe language and Ojibwe History and Culture at the University of Minnesota for twenty years until he retired in 2015. Among his many publications are “DagaAnishinaabemodaa-Let’s Speak Ojibwe” - An Ojibwe Word and Phrase Book. He has a Bachelor of Arts in Native Studies from Trent University and A Master of Arts in Education from UMD, and a Master of Arts in Indigenous Philosophy as well as a Doctorate Degree of Indigenous Education from the Seven Generation Education Institute. Pebaamibinesis also a fourth degree member in the Midewiwin Lodge which is the highest level of Ojibwe Priesthood.

## WELCOMING CONGREGATION STATUS

In 2008 Pilgrim House became a Welcoming Congregation. This is an official title from the UUA referring specifically to welcoming gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people. The UUA has set about to embrace this group as it feels the need to empower and raise up GLBT people within our community.

At this time the Congregational Care Committee would like to renew our Welcoming Congregation Status. This requires a vote by the membership at the Annual Meeting and this item will be on the agenda. Our commitment means that we will continue to have programs relevant to understanding the GLBT community, continue to use inclusive language during our programs and continue to perform weddings for GLBT people at Pilgrim House. We will also continue our connection to Outfront Minnesota, an organization that supports GLBT people.

**GREAT DECISIONS AT PILGRIM HOUSE**

**April 6 – Trade and Politics**

The U.S. political mood toward trade has gone sour. One need look no further than the 2016 presidential contest for the popular narrative: trade means that China wins, at America's expense. But do the numbers support that conclusion? The metrics used to gauge economic strength—Gross Domestic Product and balance of trade—have not kept up with the realities of modern manufacturing. Obtaining an accurate picture of U.S. economic stature requires a critique of those numbers. Only then can the U.S. develop appropriate policy solutions for the challenges at hand.

Our speaker Ambassador Ross Wilson is a distinguished fellow at the Atlantic Council and a visiting lecturer in international affairs at the George Washington University.
