His pioneering work on presidential electors has positioned him as an expert on the Electoral College. His book, <u>Representation and the Electoral College</u> (Oxford University Press, 2019) received stellar reviews and was chosen as an outstanding title by Choice Magazine for 2019.

On January 31st, the Regathering Committee (a subset of the board members and committee chairs) met to decide whether Pilgrim House should reopen for inperson programs. After some discussion, the committee decided that, due to the continuing pandemic, Pilgrim House will continue meeting via Zoom. The current wave of the pandemic appears to have peaked although hospitalizations and deaths continue to rise. Based on that, the current goal is to reopen to in-person programs on March 13 (the March 6 program is a remote speaker via Zoom).

PRECINCT CAUCUSES AND VOTING

Precinct caucuses are February 1st for all four-state recognized political parties. To find your precinct caucus go to <u>https://caucusfinder.sos.state.mn.us</u>.

The Republican Party met in Minneapolis in 1892 and adopted this provision as part of their national platform:

"We demand that every citizen of the United States shall be allowed to cast one free and unrestricted ballot in all public elections, and that such ballot shall be counted and returned as cast; that such laws shall be enacted and enforced as will secure to every citizen, be he rich or poor, native or foreign-born, white or black, this sovereign right, guaranteed by the Constitution. The free and honest popular ballot, the just and equal

representation of all the people, as well as their just and equal protection under the laws, are the foundation of our Republican institutions, and the party will never relax its efforts until the integrity of the ballot and the purity of elections shall be fully guaranteed and protected in every State."
